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## Military Relocation Programmatic Agreement Semi-Annual Report for the Period June 2013 to December 2013

A. Stipulation XII.A of the March 2011 *Programmatic Agreement for Military Relocation to Guam and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands* (hereinafter "PA") provides that in December and June of each calendar year after the (PA) is executed, or on an alternate schedule agreed to by the Signatories and Concurring Parties should projects be delayed, the Department of Defense (DoD) shall prepare a report itemizing the review activities carried out pursuant to the PA. These reports shall be provided to the Signatories and Invited Signatories and to the Concurring Parties upon their request.

The Draft Access Plan was provided to the Signatories and Invited Signatories for review on 2 August 2013. All comments were received by 16 September 2013. DoD has consolidated the comments and has made revisions to the draft plan. We are continuing to work to resolve remaining internal DoD concerns on key issues identified by the Signatories and Invited Signatories. Our intent is to provide a consolidated comment matrix with proposed resolutions and establish a conference call to review the revisions and resolutions with the Signatories and Invited Signatories before providing a final draft to the public for review.
